MINUTES

1. To record apologies for absence

Apologies were accepted from Cllr Barry Hale, Cllr Andrew Grant, Cllr Christopher Mackrell, Cllr Neil Smith.

2. To receive declarations of interest

None declared.

3. To ratify as a correct record the Minutes of the meeting held 13th February 2024

The Minutes were accepted as a correct record of the meeting and duly signed by the Chairman.

4. To record any police issues

No issues raised.

5. Ward Reports: Update the meeting on issues Councillors are attending to

Cllr Gardner told the meeting that the Rangers had cut the tree line along the proposed Miyawaki Woodland site and contractors have prepared the land in readiness for the tree planting. Cllr Taylor and Cllr Whiting will be attending on the day.

Cllr Sinnott noted that graffiti with probably tagging has been posted over road signs along Church Street and at Abbey Lakes on Wigan Borough signs.

Cllr Stoddart reminded the meeting that the Crawford Village Hut & Playing Fields Committee will be meeting this coming Friday.

It was resolved to appoint Mrs Sandra Jones as Internal Auditor.

7. Up Holland Cenotaph War Memorial – to address concerns about climbing on the fragile structure and the overgrown conifers

The Clerk was instructed to ask Cllr Ask Neil Furey, portfolio holder for Street scene, if the conifers can be cut back and whether WLBC might consider a 'no climbing' sign to deter misuse. The cenotaph design is misleading in that it has steps that appear robust but are being damaged when people sit on them.

9. Any Update from Borough or County Councillors

Up Holland Parish Council/Minutes/120324

Borough Councillor Owen reported dealing with a number of issues. Muddy, impassable sections off Ayrefield Road, pot holes (particularly around the former Stanley Public House), the WLBC carpark junction of Dingle Road and Tithebarn Street, where the grassed area is being damaged. Also noted that there had been so many youths in the bowling green recently that surrounding residents believed it had been an organised event. Borough Councillor Nicole Pryce-Roberts had revealed that Hall Green House remains part of the Housing Revenue count and Tawd Valley Developments are producing a feasibility study for the site.

10. To note Update on WLBC Local Plan

The following information was given by WLBC:

The Local Development Scheme provides the project plan for the preparation of the new Local Plan for the Borough and in summary shows that:

- The next stage of public consultation will take place at the end of 2024; and
- A consultation on the publication version of the Plan will take place in 2026 with the Plan being submitted for independent examination later that year.

The following table sets out the remaining expected steps and timescales for the preparation of the Local Plan.

Under this timetable Examination In Public is likely to take place over Christmas of 2026 (between September 2026 and March 2027) with receipt of the Examiners Report in April 2027, and adoption in the third quarter of that year – July/August/September 2027.

The parish council meeting noted the timetable with concern that there is no room for slippage in dates and that adoption may be delayed as councils are in recess during August.

13. Provision of Goods and Services

(a) Update on creation of a Miyawaki Woodland* at Mill Lane Play Area

Plans are in place to meet at 10am for risk assessment briefing at Mill Lane Play Area for tree planting. Beacon Rangers have already cut back the existing hedgerow, to allow the new trees some light, and contractors have prepared the ground. LCC Treescapes Officer Ian Wright will be leading the project. Two local primary schools are involved and certificates of participation will be given to children attending.

(b) Update on play equipment provision and removal of basketball hoop at Farley Lane

All work at Lawns Avenue Play Area is now complete.

Work inside the fenced area at Mill Lane Play Area is expected to be done in April 2024.

It was agreed to relocate the picnic benches in the hope that they will be less attractive to use as pedestal by vandals throwing mud if they are further away from the road.

It was agreed to remove the basketball hoop at Farley Lane and consider prices for a new piece of equipment there, perhaps talking flowers.

(c) Consider further the anti-social behaviour at Mill Lane Play Area & the Bowling Green

As above, the picnic tables will be moved further into the park. The exact location will be determined by those attending the tree planting on the 18th March 2024.

An updated cost of repairs will be obtained but an insurance claim can't be started until the area can be properly secured.

There are two ends of the hedge, where trees have been removed in the past, that

are vulnerable and used as access points. Ideas such as planting holly, berberis, quick thorn to deter trespassers were considered and the Clerk instructed to ask Steve Bissett at WLBC if fencing might be available to close the gap.

(d) To consider request for easement over Janet Lally Memorial Field

There was no further contact from the company so this item will be removed from future agenda.

There being no further business the Chairman closed the meeting at 8.30pm.
